Getting Ready...

This section includes information and pre-travel checklists to help you get away smoothly. We've prepared this checklist to help you make sure you don't overlook anything.

- Visa: Check your visa details and conditions here.
- Passport: Ensure your passport is valid for the intended length of your study period in Australia.
- OSHC student insurance: It is a condition of your student visa that you maintain Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of your studies. This cover needs to be arranged about the same time you accept your offer to study.
- NSW Transport: For ways to get around in Sydney and Newcastle, click here.
- Accommodation: KOI encourages all new students to arrange for their accommodation prior to their travel. Please find some of the accommodation options here.
- Consular assistance: Make a note of the contact details of your country's embassy in Australia.
- **Documentation:** Pack a document folder containing your offer letter, Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE), academic transcripts from previous study, identification documents, important contact numbers, details of pre-arranged accommodation and important medical records.
- Emergency contact number: KOI is available on an emergency after hours contact numbers for matters that may be critical. Please use the after hours emergency contact numbers 1800 313 153 or 1800 313 155.

THINGS TO DO WHEN I ARRIVE AT KOI	
Enrol in your course: Visit KOI Marketing at Level 1, 31 Market Street Campus, if you are studying in KOI Sydney Campus locations or 59 Darby Street Newcastle Campus, if you are studying in KOI Regional NSW location for enrolment and to arrange your timetable. You must enrol on campus to officially commence your studies at KOI.	
Organise your Student ID Card Students can apply for their ID card once they have enrolled and made the payment.	
Attend Orientation On-campus Orientation is compulsory for all international students.	
Check your Student Portal Click on 'Current Students' from the KOI homepage. Log-in to Moodle and complete the Academic Integrity Module. Moodle provides resources for each subject which you are enrolled in. To access Moodle, log in to the Student Portal and click the Moodle link. You must complete the Academic Integrity Module before you can access the Moodle site for each of your units.	
Access your student email This is the KOI's official method of communicating with you and must be checked regularly during the trimester
