Getting Ready..

This section includes information and pre-travel checklists to help you get away smoothly. We've prepared this checklist to help you make sure you don't overlook anything.

- **Visa:** Check your visa details and conditions [here](#).
- **Passport:** Ensure your passport is valid for the intended length of your study period in Australia.
- **OSHC student insurance:** It is a condition of your student visa that you maintain Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of your studies. This cover needs to be arranged about the same time you accept your offer to study.
- **NSW Transport:** For ways to get around in Sydney, click [here](#).
- **Accommodation:** KOI encourages all new students to arrange for their accommodation prior to their travel. Please find some of the accommodation options [here](#).
- **Consular assistance:** Make a note of the contact details of your country's [embassy in Australia](#).
- **Documentation:** Pack a document folder containing your offer letter, Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE), academic transcripts from previous study, identification documents, important contact numbers, details of pre-arranged accommodation and important medical records.
- **Emergency contact number:** KOI is available on an emergency after hours contact numbers for matters that may be critical. Please use the after hours emergency contact numbers 1800 313 153 or 1800 313 155.

THINGS TO DO BEFORE LEAVING HOME

- Arrange student visa
- Passport
- Book flights and arrange travel insurance
- Arrange accommodation
- Arrange transport from airport to accommodation
- Letter of Offer from KOI
- A copy of your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) from KOI
- Proof of OSHC (if you arranged it yourself)
- Certified copies of your qualifications & certificates
- Other formal identification (country ID card, driver's license, birth certificate)
- Written medical advice for any existing medical Conditional
