



How we assess your undergraduate application

If you are in the process of completing or have recently completed your Higher School Certificate (HSC) or its equivalent, you may obtain an Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR), which serves as a means admission into our undergraduate courses.

Alternatively, you may gain entry our undergraduate courses if you have completed a TAFE Certificate IV, Diploma, or Advanced Diploma through the TAFE.

Early Offer Scheme

This pathway offers early admission opportunities to Year 12 applicants, primarily relying on their Year 11 academic records and the recommendations or evaluations provided by their high school.



How we assess your postgraduate application

To evaluate your application, we will require certified supporting documents, which includes a proof of identity and prior educational records.

If you possess qualifications or experience that exceed the standard admission requirements, you might qualify for exemption on certain subjects.
