- Visa: Check your visa details and conditions, click here.
- Passport: Ensure your passport is valid for the intended length of your study period in Australia.
- . OSHC student insurance: It is a condition of your student visa that you maintain Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the duration of your studies. This cover needs to be arranged about the same time you accept your offer to study. (To compare which insurance is right for you, click here)
- NSW Transport: For ways to get around in Sydney and Newcastle, click here.
- · Accommodation: KOI encourages all new students to arrange for their accommodation prior to their travel. Please find some of the accommodation options, click here.
- Consular assistance: Make a note of the contact details of your country's embassy in Australia.
- Documentation: keep a document folder containing your offer letter, Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE), academic transcripts from previous study, identification documents, important contact numbers, details of pre-arranged accommodation and important medical records.
- Emergency contact number: KOI is available on an emergency after hours contact numbers for matters that may be critical. Please use the after hours emergency contact numbers 1800 313 153 or 1800 313 155.
